

# 2025 RESOLUTIONS

## KANSAS SORGHUM PRODUCERS

### PREAMBLE

The KANSASSORGHUM PRODUCERS ASSOCIATION (KSP) is committed to promoting and improving the general profitability of Kansas sorghum farmers, by developing and maintaining domestic and international markets to utilize Kansas and United States sorghum production. KSP is dedicated to focusing attention and resources on the areas that most vitally affect production, marketing, education, research and expanded domestic and international trade. The combined effects of these efforts are essential in achieving increased profitability of Kansas sorghum production. Notwithstanding any other goals, KSP recommends and adopts the following General Resolutions:

### REGULATORY OVERREACH

KSP opposes the current regulatory overreach that negatively impacts our farms, communities and the U.S. economy. We support efforts by Congress to provide oversight and relief.

KSP further opposes all attempts at overreach by Kansas regulators.

### EDUCATION and RESEARCH

KSP supports increased general funding appropriations for sorghum in Kansas. Further, we support an emphasis on funding for research that leads to improved sorghum yields and production.

*KSP recognizes the initial success of the Collaborative Sorghum Investment Program (CSIP) housed at Kansas State University under the original term from 2016-2025 and strongly supports continued 10-year funding of CSIP through the United Sorghum Checkoff Program, Kansas Grain Sorghum Commission, K-State, and increased investment from the State of Kansas.*

KSP supports increased emphasis on agricultural education in our schools and recognizes the need to integrate agricultural education into existing curriculum.

KSP encourages rapid adoption and funding by the Kansas Legislature on priorities associated with responsible expansion of crop options like sorghum in concert with the Kansas Water Authority

KSP believes the Kansas Legislature should appropriate adequate funding towards sorghum and agricultural research at Kansas State University.

### ETHANOL

KSP supports the increased availability of all ethanol blended fuels in Kansas. We further support the expansion of blender pumps to allow greater consumer choice.

KSP supports the implementation and availability of E-15 and higher fuels to provide fueling choices for consumers.

KSP supports efforts of the ethanol industry to self-promote their production.

## **FEDERAL FARM PROGRAM**

KSP supports full implementation and funding of the current farm program.

KSP strongly supports a balanced approach to deficit reduction that distributes reductions to all segments of the federal budget.

We support conservation/wildlife incentives that benefit sorghum producers.

## **TAXATION**

KSP supports the current method of agricultural property taxation and classification in Kansas.

KSP supports the continued sales tax exemption of agricultural production related items and services.

KSP supports that land taken out of private ownership for "conservation" reasons should not place additional tax burdens on remaining land.

KSP supports the elimination of federal and state estate taxes. Absent elimination, we further support that exemptions on the taxation of estates, both state and federal, be indexed for inflation.

KSP supports the reinstatement of investment tax credit programs for farmers.

KSP supports a reduction in the capital gains tax.

KSP supports permanent income averaging for farmers and other small businesses including family farm corporations.

KSP supports the 100% deduction of health care costs incurred by self-employed individuals and their families.

KSP supports an increase in the Heavy Use Vehicle Tax Exemption from 7500 miles to 15,000 miles annually.

KSP supports property tax relief by placing a greater reliance on sales *and income* tax to fund necessary government spending.

KSP opposes efforts to modify the use-value appraisal methodology that would be detrimental to agriculture. KSP supports valuation of farm use elevators based on farm use value and not based on commercial value. KSP believes that the legislature needs to review inequitable taxation of stationary farmer owned non-commercial grain handling equipment.

KSP strongly opposes efforts that would shift other forms of taxation to property tax.

KSP opposes the full funding of schools through property taxes and supports a balanced reliance on income tax and other non-property tax sources for the financing of local school districts.

## **HIGH TANNIN GRAIN SORGHUM**

KSP opposes the sale of high tannin grain sorghum seed and the planting for commercial sale without full disclosure to the first and all subsequent purchasers in the State of Kansas. Furthermore, we urge similar disclosure nationwide.

## **COMMODITY GROUP COOPERATION**

KSP supports and encourages greater communication and cooperation between all commodity groups at the state and national level. We further support that these groups should work together to present a united voice for agriculture.

## **PRIVATE PROPERTY RIGHTS**

KSP opposes any legislation that would infringe upon private property rights without compensation, including rights of usage relative to the Endangered Species Act and Clean Water Act.

## **CHECK-OFF PROGRAMS**

KSP supports the Kansas Grain Sorghum Commission and encourages said commission to work with the Kansas and National Sorghum Producers to provide expanded marketing, educational, and promotional opportunities.

KSP opposes any attempts to assess fees on commodity checkoffs that are not based on actual services provided.

KSP supports the United Sorghum Checkoff Program and encourage greater cooperation and collaboration among all programs at the state and national level.

## **PESTICIDES / FERTILIZERS / FUEL**

KSP supports continued federal and state pre-emption of local units of government in the area of pesticide regulation.

KSP supports that the State of Kansas should provide collection locations for agricultural chemical wastes in Kansas. We further support that participating producers should be granted amnesty when participating in said program.

KSP supports the agricultural site remediation program in Kansas. We further support that a broad base of funding be continued, however that no funds derived from the state fertilizer fee fund be used.

KSP supports reasonable farmer exemptions for pesticide, fertilizer, and fuel containment, when the presence of such products are incidental to application or use by the farmer in possession of the product.

KSP supports a science based process for all pesticides at the U.S. EPA.

## **CROP INSURANCE**

KSP supports that Federal Crop Insurance be offered with an increased level of government financial participation for increased levels of crop insurance.

KSP supports that actual insured county average yield should be used as the average yield rather than historical FSA county yields.

KSP supports that Federal Crop Insurance price elections for grain sorghum be set at a minimum of 100% of the corn price election.

KSP supports the development of new crop insurance products for growers facing several years of crop losses that cannot be adequately covered by current crop insurance products.

KSP supports the development of new crop insurance products for growers implementing limited water use irrigation practices.

## **TRANSPORTATION**

KSP supports the removal of barriers to international trade of grain sorghum, sorghum products, as well as livestock, poultry, and aquaculture products and the prevention of the establishment by other nations of barriers to the importation and consumption of U.S. grain sorghum, sorghum products, as well as livestock products.

KSP supports a limited seasonal tolerance exemption on weight limits for trucks moving grain from field to original destination.

## **POSTED COUNTY PRICES**

KSP supports that the Posted County Price should reflect the actual county cash price.

## **WETLANDS**

KSP supports a rational policy in determining wetlands that allow for a balance between economical agricultural production and wetland conservation.

KSP further supports that any government policy relative to wetlands or any other government designation of privately owned property, should be subject to public comment prior to finalization of any such policy.

## **WATER QUALITY STANDARDS**

KSP supports the right of the State of Kansas to determine water quality standards for Kansas. We oppose any effort of the US EPA to usurp those, or any other rights relative to the Federal Clean Water Act. We further encourage the State of Kansas to defend states' rights issues to the full extent of judicial process.

KSP opposes any attempt by US EPA to promulgate water quality standards for Kansas.

KSP opposes any changes in definitions of the waters of the U.S., especially as it relates to classification of navigable waters of the U.S.

## **WATER QUALITY INITIATIVES & TMDLs**

KSP supports research and voluntary outreach programs that are designed to help producers implement Best Management Practices. KSP further support current efforts to implement TMDLs in Kansas with education and voluntary Best Management Practices as the cornerstone.

## **WATER**

KSP supports the concepts set forth by the Kansas Water Authority in Vision for the future of Water Supply in Kansas.

KSP supports the concept of protecting producers that are conserving water.

KSP agrees the Kansas Water Authority should be the agency for water management in Kansas.

KSP supports the Kansas Water Plan Fund for cost sharing of land treatment for highly erodible lands and riparian areas, construction of livestock waste management facilities, grazing land management, plugging abandoned wells and upgrading rural septic systems.

KSP supports the concept of water flex accounts to provide water right holders greater flexibility in water utilization and profitability while at the same time protecting the source of supply and respecting existing water rights.

KSP supports the Kansas Groundwater Management District (GMD) Act which gives local water users a voice in determining the use of groundwater. Provisions of the act relating to governance, powers and authorities, and statutory parameters for the Board of Directors composition should continue to apply to all GMD's uniformly. Any changes regarding assessment mechanisms should not be a disadvantage to agricultural producers. KSP supports efforts to ensure that policies or guidelines of a groundwater management district are only applicable once they have been finally adopted as a regulation through the rule making process.

KSP supports the Blue Ribbon Task force recommendations for a funding mechanism to generate annual funding to implement Technology and Crop Varieties, namely, less water-intensive crop research and ag research.

## **COMMODITY LOAN RATES**

KSP supports that the Secretary of USDA establish the loan rate for grain sorghum at a minimum of 100% of corn, including rates established at the county level.

## **GRAIN STORAGE**

KSP supports financial incentives for the expansion of grain storage in Kansas.

## **IMMIGRATION**

KSP supports reasonable immigration reform that provides a needed legal workforce for agriculture.

## **TECHNOLOGY**

KSP supports responsible use of unmanned Aerial vehicle(s) in crop production including reasonable laws and regulations ensuring public safety and privacy. KSP encourages expeditious development of said regulations by FAA.

## **NSP RESOLUTIONS**

KSP supports the National Sorghum Producers Resolutions for the current year; upon review and consensus by the KSP board; and where applicable, said resolutions shall also be considered resolutions of KSP.

## **KSP BOARD of DIRECTORS**

KSP supports the right of the KSP Board of Directors to make additions or other adjustments as necessary to KSP resolutions. All changes shall clearly be in the best interest of KSP and its members. Any changes shall be reported to the membership in a timely manner and such changes shall be reviewed by the full membership at the next annual meeting.
